## Leaping from GCSE to A Level

- In your own words, write about the designer / maker (minimum of 300 words on typed A4 – again present this, perhaps include a picture of them?



- Using the same designer/maker for inspiration, produce <u>2 high quality</u> A3 design sheets and <u>redesign</u> an everyday product (phone, kettle, spoon, remote control etc.). Remember to explain the designer/maker's influence, add colour, draw in 3D, add a title and make this your best work.
- 4. Using any modelling material available to you, produce a scale model of your most creative design (cereal box card is fine!).
