During this period, sweatshop conditions were rampant in the factories where Nike's products were made. The company-maintained contracts with these factories, and they were also disregarding labour laws.

The public backlash against Nike, which was 30 years old at the time, tarnished the company's image and negatively affected its bottom line. According to researchers at Stanford University, the company was being accused of exploiting workers to expand its profits.
