

NWG + SUTTON TRUST Pathways To Banking & Finance Programme.

The Sutton Trust champions social mobility from birth to the workplace. We support students from less advantaged backgrounds to access careers, apprenticeships and universities directly through our **programmes** whilst publishing **research** and policy recommendations to influence national change.

Our **Pathways to Banking & Finance** programme provides students aged 16-18 with the skills, knowledge and experience they need to access a career in the sector. Too often this requires professional connections, the ability to take on unpaid internships, or soft skills which are not always easily taught at schools. It is completely free, targeted, has both in-person and online versions and the application process is quick and easy. After an eighteen-month period of comprehensive activity, students walk away with:

- Work experience where they learn practical skills, increase their professional connections and gain knowledge of the sector.
- **Employability** skills sessions and workshops on how to find, apply and succeed in their chosen career.

As one of four consortium industry partners, NatWest Group makes a meaningful investment in both the funding and delivery of this programme. Our partners provide their time and expertise through offering work experience and participating in insight opportunities for students. - their collective help makes our work possible, shapes the programme and enables us to reach more young people.

NATWEST GROUP MENTOR SCHEME

I started my career in Financial Services through a graduate program. This was a very structured process and I benefited from similar mentoring support as a part of my graduate scheme. Knowing how important this was for my career development, I wanted to do the same for the young people looking to take advantage through the CareerReady mentoring program at NatWest.

I found my experience last year very insightful. It became apparent very quickly that the young girl I was supporting had lots of questions and little understanding of how it works outside of formal education. What I realised through the process is that most young people have a good understanding what next looks like in their education journey but little or no understanding of what to do next, when the clearly defined education journey finishes. I think mentoring program such as this will really help these very capable people make informed decisions on career paths and how to set themselves up for success.

It was very rewarding on a personal level to be able to share my experience and offer some guidance that may potentially help the individual make informed decisions. In particular, a lot of sessions with my mentee were focused on effective communication, being proactive in building professional networks as well as problem solving.

Through my experience last year with my young person – I believe they took away insight and actionable ideas to plan their steps post formal education. This was hugely satisfying for me to experience and to know that I potentially helped my mentee to make better choices or to perhaps achieve her potential. I would strongly recommend this experience and ask all young people to take full advantage and for colleagues across the bank to get involved as everyone benefits from this experience.




