- We are founder members of the Mental Health Support Team (MHST) having worked with Brighter Futures and the NHS to establish the 1st Reading MHST and continue to contribute to its development.
- We work proactively with the MHST and other external agencies to provide additional support where needed.
- From September 2025, we will continue to have a weekly lunch time wellbeing drop-in opportunity, for Year 7 students, in collaboration with Soulscape.










Timings of school Fri 5th Sept 8.25am in school.

- An ambitious curriculum for all our students.









The programme covers homework setting, seating plans achievements and behaviour.


Parents will need to download the App to access their child's homework and other information.

Parent Pay



- The school is a cash free environment and we use ParentPay to allow parents to make payments for all school trips and canteen services.
- If your child uses the school canteen services, you must ensure that the account is kept in credit
- Free School Meals are automatically added please remember to apply for FSM via the school website if you haven't already -<u>https://www.hughfaringdon.org/you/free-school-meal</u>.



Biometric System

- Students do not carry a card or cash tills are facial recognition.
- Cashless system in place (no cash to be taken in the canteen)
- Any amount of money can be paid into a student's account, and any money spent on food and drink will be deducted daily.
- A daily 'spend' limit of £5 is programmed into the system.











- A free breakfast is available every morning from 8am provided by BHF.
- Snack Shack in the KS3 playground
- Own packed lunch is an option.
- Eat in canteen, main hall, canopy



- Our catering manager is available this evening in the canteen area where you can ask about allergies and any other concerns about food and to taste samples
- FSM get the SET meal and pudding at LUNCH <u>£3.10 any</u>
 purchases at break will reduce options at lunchtime



- Uniform now supplied by Valentino School wear (here tonight in the main hall)
- Parents can order by telephone, website, school shop or Valentino shop (Hook or Woking).

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- School shop is open for drop in every Wednesday 10.30 2.30pm from September.
- List of available opening dates for BHF shop on Valentino website but you must ring to make an appointment so that they can meet you here
- School also offer refurbished uniform for parents to purchase from the office

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




<u>School PE Kit</u>

 - Correct PE kit






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<u>Maths Equipment</u>

- There will be a bundle pack available on parentpay from September for approximately £12.










What NOT to bring

- The school runs a 'X' account with updates regarding sports fixtures



- Sports/Drama/Music/Council groups/Journalism and more!






Attendance and Punctuality

PLEASE do not take students in term time.
Please inform the school if your child is not attending school via phone or email



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- •Students must arrive to each lesson on time, if arrival is more than 5 minutes late to the lesson, L mark will be given & persistent tardiness will result in sanctions
- •25 minutes of missed learning everyday
- 2.08 hours of learning every week missed = 3.4 days in a year = grades achieved



Summer Literacy Challenge



When children read over the summer they are more likely to leap ahead when they return to school? This is often called the "summer leap."



This graph shows what happens EVERY SUMMER when students don't keep reading.

Your literacy (reading and writing ability) takes a tumble.

This means students have more of a struggle when they get back to school!


