

### **School Expectations**

### **Attendance**

- The school attendance target is 96%
- Every student is expected to be striving to meet and exceed this target

If you have 90% attendance (Persistent absentee)

- Equivalent to ½ a day per week
- Equivalent to 4 weeks over a school year

Over the course of your GCSEs that is 8 weeks, more than a term!



### **School Expectations**

### **Punctuality**

- Every student must
  - Arrive at school on time (in tutor for 8.35am)
  - Arrive at and attend all tutor sessions
  - Arrive to all lessons on time

If students arrive 5 minutes late to every lesson

- That is 30 minutes of missed learning every day
- 2.5 hours of learning missed every week
- 5 lates in a week= Punctuality report

### **Phones**








### English Language GCSE

- A GCSE is awarded when students complete two papers of 1hour
   45 minutes and a speaking and listening assessment.
- You can help students revise for Language by encouraging them to read to raise reading speed, exam expediency and proficiency.
   There are also revision resources online (youtube have plenty for each question) and Q and A sites such as Seneca.
- Students can also prepare for this exam through practice. There are practice exam papers for students to pick up from the office and online on the AQA website. We also have revision guides and workbooks at £3.50 or 7.00 for a GCSE Lang set each on sale to be collected from teachers.
- Intervention and tuition skills will also be made available. Holiday and early morning sessions had a lot of impact on our 2024 results which were well above national average.
- Mock in November on paper 1 and in January P2 to decide upon early entry for GCSE \* after one of our mixed ability classes took the GCSE last year to create a more single focus on Literature. We enter based on data.
- Mocks end of Year June Paper 1 Lit and P2 language










### English Literature - What the Literature texts look like. ..

- English literature is a GCSE awarded for the completion of two papers based on the texts on the left. Some students will follow the Eduqas route rather than AQA depending on the skills they have. The same texts are used by both exam boards, bar set poetry. We choose who will do Eduqas later in the year when we are clear on who might benefit the most as the exam board requirements suit different students and we want to give students, with different skill sets than those required for AQA, equal opportunities.
- All students are given copies of Lord of the Flies, Jekyll and Hyde, Power and Conflict Poems and Macbeth. If possible, please ensure they bring these to each lesson on these texts as all their notes are in them.
- Educake homework is set as well as essays to help with continuous revision and understanding of texts.
- Please also be aware of revision guides and workbooks available at the school or online (Amazon) by CGP and other providers for all set texts.
- You can also subscribe online to Mr Bruff and other providers as well as utilize youtube for analysis of all the set texts via scene, chapter, character and theme. PixL literature can also be used.

Interventions at lunchtimes will sometimes run with Year 11 peer support.

Interventions will also be offered and similarly the holiday, after school and early morning sessions will be available. These also impacted on our results this summer.
