

Overview

Pupils will study the **new reformed GCSE courses in all subjects.**

The new GCSEs are graded from 1 to 9, with 9 being the highest.


All new GCSEs are linear with assessment at the end of the course and content is not divided into modules. Some comprise a practical element.

Most courses only have a single exam tier.

BTEC courses involve both internally and externally assessed units of study.

New GCSE grading structure

Main points to consider:

- Grade 9 is the new measure this will be awarded for exceptional performance – it is higher than the 'old' A*.
- Grade 4 equates to standard C
- Grade 5 equates to a high C
- The government requirement for a 'good' pass at GCSE is a grade 5, higher than the old requirement of a C.

How to make choices

Consider your interests and hobbies

Aim for a broad and balanced curriculum – including a variety of subjects

Consider how subjects are assessed, some are 100% exams, others involve coursework.



Do not On the other hand....

Choose a subject just because your friends are taking it

Choose a subject just because you like your current teacher

Choose too many similar subjects- Assessed in the same way

Choose a subject because you think it is an 'easy option'

Choose a new subject simply because it's new!



Attendance

- To get the most out of a good education, attendance is crucial.
- School attendance has a major influence on educational outcomes.
- Transition from Key Stage 3 to Key Stage 4
- 90% attendance = a month of learning in an academic year

Choosing your Options

Core Subjects (subjects that must be studied by all)

Religious Education

English Language and English Literature

Mathematics

Science (We will assign Separate or Trilogy and stunts/parents will be notified in due course)

PE (Non-exam)

PSHE (scheduled lessons)

Students will also select from several option subjects. Their choice of subject will be dependent upon their pathway. If a student wants to study Business they should choose the subject and as a school will decide if they follow the GCSE Business or BTEC Enterprise Pathway.



Pathway 1 -EBacc and Optional Subjects

- The EBacc is a set of subjects at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers.
- The EBacc is:
 - English Language and Literature
 - Maths
 - The Sciences
 - Geography or History
 - MFL Modern Foreign Language
- The EBacc is made up some of the subjects which are considered essential to many degrees and can be useful to students who intend to stay in full time education after GCSE.

Reserve Options


We aim to invite all students to study the courses they choose.

If a situation arises where they will not get their first choice, we will inform you.






