Philosophy

Life After Death PRESENTATION

Consider the following areas for development:

Types of Life after Death and what evidence there is for each type including religious points of view.

(Include Scholars, images and evidence of wider research/reading from a variety of sources including electronic media)

Remember to use the below sources of research in your presentation.

- a) explain the terms –embodied existence, disembodied existence, reincarnation, resurrection, replica, memes, dualism, monism, materialism
- b) outline the views of Plato and Aristotle AND Dawkins about Life after Death
- *c)* Watch the movie "*Ghost*" and outline evidence of Life after Death and explain the strengths and weaknesses of each <u>type of evidence</u> to a Philosopher discussing the validity of Life after death. You may consider comparing to other films such as "*Ghost Town*" or "*Constantine*"

The following research is OPTIONAL but will be **essential as evidential material** as we move through the <u>course</u>

d.) Research in detail a Miracle accepted by the Committee at Lourdes- e.g. Jeanne Fretel and Gariel Gargam. Explain what happened and why it might be considered a Miracle. (Refer to the Committee criteria)

e) Research and make detailed notes on St Paul. Know the story of his conversion, being able to compare his life before and after his conversion experience.

f) Research and make notes on Bernadette of Lourdes and Teresa of Avila, knowing the stories of their Religious Experiences

<u>Ethics</u>

To complete this task, you need to know the definition of Ethics and what we mean when we say "it's an ethical issue"

- 1. Research an ethical issue that is currently making news headlines, or one that has recently been in the news the "handling" of the COVID-19 pandemic, or the war in Ukraine, spring to mind, as an example, but there are many others.
- 2. Make a presentation that shows:
 - a.) Your knowledge of the issue.
 - b.) Why it has become newsworthy.
 - c.) Why it is an ethical issue in the first place.
 - d.) Your opinion.

Each should be written taking the following into account:

- a. Not have ANY copy and pasting
- b. Include references to your research (for example, if you use a quote where did it come from?)
- c. Be professionally put together to A level standard (spellchecked, correctly punctuated, clear presentation)
- d. Include YOUR opinions rather than simply writing all about what other people think.
- e. This is much more effective done in the form of a power point presentation as it allows you to effectively insert images and clips!!
